That is, get down low to the ground to allow the hunter to throw a net over the covey of birds. If you have never seen your dog find a bird and go on point you will be truly amazed. Come out and spend the day with our dogs, good friends and good food. If you would like to help we would love to show you the ins and outs of hunt tests. If you are a little

uncertain of what you can do to help just come down and watch. We can show you how to perform the various things that need to be done and you can see just how incredible our dogs can be. Enter your dog and see how it all works. You will be amazed and there will be many experienced people to give you pointers and explain the finer points of hunting. For those who are uncomfortable with the birds or the idea of hunting in general rest assured the birds fly away at the Junior level and neither you or your dog have to touch them.
